

**Summary of the:**

**GQA Level 3 NVQ in Inspecting and Designing Chimneys and Dry Solid Fuel Installations (Construction)(610/2278/0)**

**Who is this qualification for?**

This qualification is aimed at individuals wishing to prove they have the level and range of knowledge and skills required to inspect and design chimneys and dry solid fuel installations. All work must be completed following Industry recognised Safe Working Practices and in accordance with relevant legislation.

This qualification is at Level 3, although some units may be at different levels and should be taken by those who are fully trained to deal with a range of tasks and situations and carry out the installation work in situations that have complex requirements.

**Assessment Guidance**

Evidence should show that you can complete all of the learning outcomes for each unit being taken.

**Types of evidence:**

Evidence of performance and knowledge is required. Evidence of performance should be demonstrated by activities and outcomes, and should be generated in the workplace only, unless indicated under potential sources of evidence (see below). Evidence of knowledge can be demonstrated through performance or by responding to questions.

**Quantity of evidence:**

Evidence should show that you can meet the requirements of the units in a way that demonstrates that the standards can be achieved consistently over an appropriate period of time.

**Potential sources of evidence:**

The main source of evidence for each unit will be observation of the candidate's performance and knowledge demonstrated during the completion of the unit. This can be supplemented by the following types of physical or documentary evidence:

- Accident book/reporting system
- Notes and memos
- Safety record
- Telephone/e-mail records
- Training record
- Customer and colleague feedback
- Audio evidence
- Records of equipment and materials
- Witness testimonies
- Work records
- Photographic/ video evidence
